  - b. Draft emergency escape route maps and post them in each classroom
  - c. Have emergency preparedness school assemblies
  - d. Evaluate, replace and expand contents of the emergency bins as needed.

4. Support school wide planning initiative to expand science and technology in the curriculum through:

  - b. Purchasing lab materials
  - c. Purchasing additional science books for the school library and classrooms
  
5. Continue to promote student literacy through various school activities such as:

  - e. Purchasing books and supplies for the school library
  - f. Used Book Sale
